


## Presidential Address

During the past several years, as members of the House and Archives Committee, my colleague Neal Cronin and I have reviewed the minutes and reports of the New York Academy of Dentistry that have been compiled since our last published history in 1974.

In that capacity I have had the opportunity to review numerous Presidential acceptance speeches. Most have been delivered by individuals far more eloquent than I. Many have quoted the purpose of the Academy as elucidated by those visionary founders who chartered the Academy in 1921. Some have discussed singular issues that would earmark their terms as President over the course of the Academic Year. While there are several items that will preoccupy my term as President, it is not my intent to discuss those items tonight.

Instead, I would like to make an observation. In reviewing the Academy history, or any history for that matter, one is impressed by the number of issues that seem of crucial importance at the time of their occurrence, but which viewed in retrospect, turn out to be quite insignificant. Often, these seemingly seminal events are accompanied by calls for drastic changes lest we lose relevance in the changing world or fall into obsolescence. Thankfully, calm voices usually surface counseling adherence to our core principals and the ideals formulated by our founders, and as the crisis passes the wisdom of those voices is vindicated. Conversely, often seemingly insignificant events lead to a major movement or shift on the part of the Academy and as the future unfolds, it becomes clear that these ideas become so dominant because they correspond with those same sentiments and principals.

Our profession and our Academy have endured many challenges and changes over the years. Despite this, an adherence to those principals outlined by our founders has served to keep the Academy relevant as a force for good within our profession and our community.

In the past several months our nation has witnessed changes of historic magnitude and it remains to be seen what future affect they will have on our profession. While no institution can sustain viability if it is fixated on the past, history has shown that with our eyes on the future and the vision of our founders fixed in our minds, we shall continue to uphold those ideals which advance the “dignity and honor of the Dental Profession” and allow us to continue to be a force for good within our community and our world.

#### MISSION

## MESSAGE FROM THE EDITOR

When a candidate is given consideration for Fellowship in the New York Academy of Dentistry, certain criteria must be evaluated. Education, knowledge, skill, talent, ability to get along with others, and leadership capabilities are all qualities that build a strong curriculum vitae. However, the final judgment of an individual candidate must be based on character.

In recent years, we have witnessed a myriad of skilled and talented individuals at the pinnacle of their respective fields, falling short of character and freefalling to self-destruction of all that is important in life. We are in an era when pleasure is considered over integrity, when responsibility for one's actions is denied and when excuses (ie: "everyone else is doing it so that makes it okay" or "I am not perfect, I am only human") qualify unethical rationale. We have seen a dramatic decline in personal accountability, ethics, and civility. Increasingly, we are ethically challenged to evaluate individuals for more than their popularity, skill and talent... and for more than their celebrity or office.

I think that proponents of character would applaud the New York Academy of Dentistry for being a stable, unyielding force and a courageous example when it comes to protecting the integrity and character of our profession. Many agree that by adhering to the principles of the Academy's Mission Statement, we stay constant and steadfast. Consider the familiar quotation "Our thoughts become words, our words become actions, our actions become habits, and our habits determine our character." The national organization, Character Counts, describes character with six core ethical values: citizenship, trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, caring, and fairness.

## RESEARCH GRANT ABSTRACT

### DENTAL SERVICES AT HARLEM UNITED: THE INFLUENCE OF CLIENTS' DENTAL FEAR

**Introduction:** Harlem United Community AIDS Center (HU) is a community-based organization in New York City that provides comprehensive dental, medical, and supportive health care to over 3,500 clients annually. Most HU clients are HIV/AIDS positive; some have a history of substance abuse, homelessness, and mental illness, and most have a history of limited or no access to quality health care.

**Objectives:** In an earlier intake survey, reported at Birnberg 2008, new patients at the HU dental clinic identified “fear of the dentist and/or pain” as the most prevalent reason for not going to the dentist regularly. Building on this finding, the goal of the present study was 1) to describe new and established HU patients’ oral health-related habits, 2) to describe the extent of their dental fear and anxiety, 3) to identify and understand the relationship between their dental fear, perceived quality of oral health, and their patterns of dental services utilization, and 4) ultimately to use the results of this study, as warranted, to target the delivery of better dental care to HU dental clients.

**Material and Method:** Of 107 candidate dental patients, 103 English-speaking patients (response rate = 96%) were recruited and participated in the study while seated in the dental clinic’s waiting area. (Nine patients preferred to speak in Spanish and were not eligible to participate in this phase of the study). Two student research assistants interviewed the patients using a pre-coded questionnaire asking about their oral habits and perspective on their current health care status, reasons for their dental visit, past

experiences in receiving dental care, and perception and definition of dental fear. Responses were entered into a computer-based data set and analyzed using SPSS. 15.0.

**Results:** Sample members were predominantly established patients (76%) at HU Dental Clinic; 17% of sample members were new patients. Seventy-five percent of the sample had been to the dentist within the past 6 months while 41% of the sample reported going to the dentist more than twice a year. Less than 10% reported the presence of pain while 22% stated their main reason for visiting the dentist was the presence of a problem/something bothering them. The reported level of dental fear was modest with 57% of participants reporting no fear of having dental work done. Extramural (45%) referral patients generally reported lower levels of fear relative to intramural (39%) referral patients. Mean level of fear of dental equipment (2.3 on a scale of 1-5) was the highest mean level of fear among the four types of dental fear identified using factor analysis: fear of the dental setting, fear of dental equipment, fear associated with anticipating the appointment, and presence of physiological signs of fear. In cross-tabular analyses, fear of dental work was most associated with dental service utilization and self-assessed status of oral health (OH) and OH quality of life. In multivariate analyses, the likelihood of having a dental visit within the past 6 months was significantly associated with level of fear of having dental work done, extent of the self-reported physiological sign “my heart beats faster”, and being a new patient.

**Discussion:** Our research indicates a high rate of dental service utilization within a sample largely composed of established HU patients. Despite their fear, as measured by their self-reported physiological response, the likelihood of these clients having received dental care within the past six months was high. We believe clients are supported in this effort by the holistic approach employed by HU in delivering comprehensive health care. The high percentage of HU clients who visit the dental clinic without pain, and the frequency with which they visit the clinic, further supports our claim. The high level of utilization of dental services also potentially serves as an indicator of the numerous dental needs of HIV/AIDS patients, since many utilize dental services for routine follow up visits, as well as a potential reflection of previous histories of limited access to, or lack of, oral health care.

**Conclusion:** Greater understanding of the role of dental fear can help frame future delivery of dental care at HU, bringing into focus consideration whether new programmatic initiatives are necessary to address the level and types of fear expressed.

## RESEARCH GRANT ABSTRACT

### COMPARISON OF ORAL BACTERIAL COMPOSITION AFTER THE USE OF TWO COMMERCIALY AVAILABLE MOUTHWASHES

*In-vivo* dental plaque composition over a three-week period was analyzed.

**Objective:** The objective of this study was to determine and quantify changes in the cariogenic microbial community in dental plaque between two mouthwash uses. This was done using polymerase chain reaction-based denaturing gradient gel electrophoresis (PCR-DGGE) approaches.

**Methods:** Thirty (30) healthy adults participated in a double-blind study using two commercially available mouthwashes (F and Z). The treatment regimen was 60 seconds of rinsing the whole mouth, with a 1 week washout period prior to the study, and a 1 week washout period between products. Supra-gingival plaque samples were collected at baseline and 24-hours post-rinsing for each product. Total bacterial genomic DNA was isolated (Epicenter). Targeted 16S rDNA genes

were amplified using a PCR approach with two gene-specific primer sets for oral lactobacilli and oral streptococci. DGGE was performed to generate the bacterial profile of the plaque. Fingerprinting II Informatix™ software (Bio-Rad) was used to compare the differences in bacterial profiles between baseline and post-rinsing, based on the Pearson correlation coefficient. Non-parametric statistical tests were used to evaluate the variation in bacterial composition between the products.

**Results:** Our preliminary results showed changes in the total bacterial profiles after using the two mouthwashes, particularly product F.

**Conclusion:** We anticipate that the results of our analysis will demonstrate the antibacterial benefits of both mouthwashes. The findings of the study will provide the public with

clinical evidence of the advantages of maintaining good oral health using such products. Supported by an Award from the New York Academy of Dentistry and Research Funds of the Colgate-Palmolive Company.

## 2008-2009 GUEST SPEAKER ABSTRACTS

### THE NEW GT SERIES X FILE SYSTEM: A CONFLUENCE OF SAFETY, SPEED AND SIMPLICITY

The balance of safety and efficiency can be tenuous, with radical differences in file function resulting from apparently minor changes in file geometry. When coupled with new methods for treating nickel-titanium, the results can be revolutionary. Research will be presented that are the results of the development of the GT Series X Files.

Dr. L. Stephen Buchanan was valedictorian of his class at the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry and completed the Endodontic Graduate program at Temple University in Philadelphia, PA in 1980. He began pursuing 3-D anatomy research early in his career, and in 1986 he became the first person in dentistry to use micro CT technology to show the intricacies of root structure.

In 1989 he established Dental Education Laboratories, and subsequently built a state-of-the-art teaching laboratory devoted to hands-on endodontic instruction, where he continues to teach today. Through Dental Education Laboratories, he has lectured and conducted participation courses around the world, published numerous articles, and produced an award-winning video series, *The Art of Endodontics*.

In addition to his activities as an educator and practicing clinician, Dr. Buchanan holds a number of patents for dental instruments and techniques. Most notably, he was the first to introduce variably-tapered shaping instruments for use in endodontic therapy and pioneered a system-based approach to treating root canals.

Dr. Buchanan is a diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and a fellow of the International and American Colleges of Dentistry. He also serves as an assistant clinical professor at the University of Southern California School of Dentistry and at the University of California, Los Angeles School of Dentistry. Dr. Buchanan also maintains a private practice limited to endodontics and implant surgery in Santa Barbara, CA.

### CHANGING PARADIGMS IN RECONSTRUCTION OF THE POSTERIOR MAXILLA

The atrophic posterior maxilla presents unique challenges to implant reconstructive therapy. Poor quantity and quality of available bone, significant ridge atrophy resulting in non-ideal location of the residual ridge, significant sinus pneumatization, and documented higher failure rates of implant therapy in the posterior maxilla unite to form a unique challenge. However, there is no doubt that predictable means exist by which to perform successful reconstructive therapy in these areas. The question becomes not what therapies are available, but which treatment approaches are indicated in different situations.

This presentation will discuss, through the review of the data from thousands of cases treated by the speaker, the most appropriate means by which to effect reconstruction of the atrophic posterior maxilla. A detailed discussion of implant placement at the time

of maxillary molar extraction will also be carried out.

Dr. Paul Fugazzotto received his DDS from New York University in 1979 and a certificate in advanced graduate studies in periodontology from Boston University in 1981. Since that time, Dr. Fugazzotto has maintained a private practice limited to periododontics and implant therapy in Milton, MA. Dr. Fugazzotto has authored or co-authored over 8 articles in refereed scientific journals, as well as authoring a monograph entitled "Guided Tissue Regeneration: Maximizing Clinical Results" and a textbook entitled "Preparation of the Periodontium for Restorative Dentistry". A second book, "Decision Making in Regenerative and Implant Therapies", is in press. Dr. Fugazzotto is an active member of many organizations, and is a fellow of the

International Team of Implantology. Dr. Fugazzotto is Senior Editor of *Implant Realities* and lectures nationally and internationally on a multitude of topics.

### OPTIONS IN BREAST RECONSTRUCTION

Mark R. Sultan, MD, FACS

Breast cancer, unfortunately, strikes one in every eight American women. Therefore, essentially families will be affected at some time by this devastating diagnosis.

Although breast conservation methods are utilized often in the treatment of breast cancer, mastectomy remains a mainstay of therapy. Therefore, successful breast reconstruction is critical to the well being of multitudes of breast cancer victims and their loved ones.

There are multiple options currently available for breast reconstruction, including the use of implants or autologous tissue. A review of these options, along with their realistic expectations and risks, will be presented.

Dr. Mark Sultan is a board certified plastic surgeon and the Chief of the Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery of Beth Israel Continuum Health Care System. He graduated with Phi Beta Kappa honors from Brandies University and received his MD from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. He completed his internship and residency in general surgery at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center and his plastic surgery residency at

the same institution, where he was chosen as Chief Resident. He received the Allen O. Whipple award for Outstanding Performance in Surgery and he was also elected to the prestigious Alpha Omega Alpha Society while at Columbia. Dr. Sultan was also awarded a fellowship in Head and Neck Surgery and Microvascular Reconstruction at Emory University Affiliated Hospitals in Atlanta.

Since 1990, Dr. Sultan has held teaching appointments and has trained residents in plastic surgery. He has served as Associate Professor of Clinical Surgery at Columbia University and is currently an Attending Surgeon at Beth Israel Medical Center and St. Luke's/Roosevelt Hospital, as well as the New York Eye and Ear Infirmary. He is certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery and a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. Dr. Sultan is an active member of the American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons, Northeast Regional Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons, New York Head and Neck Society, the Society of Reconstructive Microsurgery and the prestigious American Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery. He holds the position of Secretary for the New York Regional

Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and participates in the American Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeons Scientific Program.

As a leading expert in facial cosmetic surgery and cosmetic and reconstructive surgery of the breast, Dr. Sultan has been called on to lecture extensively on these and other topics at national medical conferences. He has published numerous papers on esthetic and reconstructive techniques in the medical literature, and has written many textbook chapters on various topics in Plastic surgery. Due to his special interest in breast reconstruction, he frequently lectures to women's groups and devotes his time to programs of the American Cancer Society for breast cancer awareness.

Dr. Sultan has been listed in New York Magazine as one of 'The Best Doctors in New York' and in the Castle Connolly Medical Guide., 'The Best Doctors of the New York Metro Area.' He is a native of New Jersey and specializes in aesthetic and reconstructive plastic surgery of the face, breast and body.

### THE AGING FACE: HOW THE DENTAL TEAM ENHANCES FACIAL AND DENTAL ESTHETICS FOR A LIFETIME

The plastic surgeon is associated with restoration of youthfulness, but dentists and their teams are extremely important in planning overall restoration of a youthful appearance. This presentation will cover how the face and smile age, and present new concepts in orthodontic treatment planning that enhance our patient's appearance for the long haul. These

principles are also critical in improving interdisciplinary planning by anticipating these changes and producing outstanding cosmetic treatment results, and will be liberally demonstrated with case presentations.

Dr. David Sarver received his DMD from the University of Alabama School of

Dentistry in 1973 and his MS in Orthodontics from the University of North Carolina in 1979. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, a member of the Edward H. Angle Society of Orthodontists, and a fellow in both the International and American College of Dentists.

In addition to his private practice, Dr. Sarver has authored or co-authored over 60 scientific articles and 12 book chapters. His book, "Esthetics in Orthodontics and Orthognatic Surgery" was published in September 1998. He is also co-author (with Drs. Proffit and White) of the new surgical text "Contemporary Treatment of Dentofacial Deformity", published by Mosby, Inc., and is co-author of the 4th Edition of Proffit's classic textbook "Contemporary

Orthodontics". In 2003, his two part article, co-authored with Dr. Marc Ackerman, on smile analysis won the 2004 B.F. Dewal Award for the best clinical article in the American Journal of Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopedics. He has given more than 250 professional presentations in the United States, Europe, Australia and the Middle and Far East, including both the Salzmann and Mershon Lectures at the AAO. Dr. Sarver has recently been featured on

NBC's "The Today Show", ABC's "The View" and Fox News.

### SUCCESSFUL MANAGEMENT OF ACUTE PAIN

Kenneth M. Hargreaves, DDS, PhD

March 2, 2009

A conflict exists for many practitioners in the area of pain control. Many of our patients remain fearful of dental procedures and this fear is often translated into neglected care. On the other hand, effective strategies for acute pain management are available to all practitioners and are based on high levels of clinical evidence. This presentation will focus on practical, evidence based studies that provide compelling new strategies for diagnosing, preventing and treating acute dental pain.

Ken Hargreaves received his BA in neurobiology from the University of California at Berkeley in 1977, his DDS from Georgetown University in

Washington DC in 1983, and his PhD (Physiology) from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, Bethesda, MD in 1986. From 1986 to 1990, he was a Staff Fellow and Senior Staff Fellow at the Neurobiology and Anesthesiology Branch of the National Institute of Dental Research (now NIDCR) at the NIH. He completed his residency in Endodontics at the University of Minnesota in 1993 and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics.

Dr. Hargreaves is currently Professor and Chair of the Department of Endodontics and professor in the Department of Pharmacology at the University of Texas

Health Science Center at San Antonio. He also maintains a private practice limited to endodontics. His primary research interests are in the areas of pain and inflammation, and he and his research team have published more than 100 papers and two books (Selzer and Bender's Dental Pulp, co-edited with Harold Goodis and the 9th Edition of Pathways of the Pulp, co-edited with Stephen Cohen and Karl Keiser).

prize. The prize could be raised from possibly \$150 to three or four hundred dollars. The selection among a half dozen ethics book was:


"The Ethical Brain", Michael S. Gazzaniga (Director of the Center for Cognitive Neuroscience at Dartmouth College), 2005, \$25

### Medically Essential Dental Care

One manifestation of the difficult economic circumstances challenging the country is the reduction in support for publicly financed health care programs. The unmanageably large number of people who needed extensive but unaffordable and uncovered dental care before state and local governments began eviscerating social and public health programs has increased substantially. That is creating a dilemma for the Donated Dental Services (DDS) program and its network of generous volunteers as people in ever increasing numbers seek help. One option being considered to address is the problem of developing a medical history triage system so applicants with medically-essential dental treatment needs can be prioritized for help.

Among people in that category are those requiring prerequisite treatment of oral inflammation and infections to be approved for organ transplantation. **Tragic but true, individuals have experienced unique morbidity and some have died because they were unable to obtain dental clearance for a transplant.** Similarly, chemotherapy for individuals with cancer and autoimmune diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis and multiple sclerosis has been delayed because of concerns that the resulting immunosuppression would facilitate the seeding of septicemias from oral lesions. Orthopedic and cardiac surgeries have also been deferred until dental infections could be resolved. People with uncontrolled diabetes are at risk of serious co-morbidities may also be considered for medically-essential dental

treatment if they have chronic periodontal infections potentially compromising medical management.

We need your help! DDS volunteers are seeing these very vulnerable patients as quickly as possible, however there is a shortage of general dentists and prosthodontists, and a waiting list of 180 needy individuals in New York City alone.


